“Modern Masters”

March 29: Dot-to-Dot Seurat

The class will be introduced to the work of Georges Seurat and the technique of pointillism. Then the children will have the opportunity to create their own pointillism masterpiece using Q-tips and paint.

April 5: Kandinsky For All

The class will be introduced to the work of Wassily Kandinsky and the use of expressive qualities of line and color. Using pastels the children will create their own composition using the techniques of Kandinsky.

April 12: Jack “the dripper” Pollock

The class will be introduced to the work of Jackson Pollock, specifically his “drip” paintings. Using straws, paint and imagination the children will create their own drip paintings.

April 19: Pop Art a la Warhol

The class will be introduced to the work of Andy Warhol, specifically the work entitled “100 Soup Cans”. Using copies of bold graphics the children will create their own Pop Art series of work.

April 26: Building Klimt

The class will be introduced to the work of Gustav Klimt and the use of shapes and patterns. By using their listening skills and their imaginations, the children will build their own Klimt-esque works of art.

May 3: Picasso Portraits

The class will be introduced to the work of Pablo Picasso, specifically his portraits and self-portraits. Using pastels, the children will create their own self-portraits in the style of Picasso.
