A Message from the Executive Director

It has been an exciting three years. Since I arrived at the museum three years ago on February 1, 2016, we have put together a strong team of staff, docents, board members, and volunteers all working together to achieve our mission and strategic goals. In the last year, we have particularly focused on our education goals and witnessed great success. Yet, the financial health of the museum has exceeded expectations as well. As you will read below, our income this year has bested the twenty years for which we have electronic records. Furthermore, in the three years we have been working together, the AKMA has seen its gross income rise 30% over the previous three years. More impressively, the last three years has witnessed a 294% increase in net revenue compare to the period between 2013 and 2015. But we will not be resting on our laurels. We look forward to working with you this year to see if we can extend this pattern of growth.

What was New at the Museum in 2018?

Debuting in 2017, but closing in 2018, Memory of Water and Visions in Monochrome adorned the museum's galleries early in 2018. Our annual membership and high school exhibitions remained popular and saw large numbers of entries once again. In March, there were two new exhibitions. Armin Mühsam: Archipeinture highlighted the paintings and collage work of Northwest Missouri art professor Armin Mühsam. A Life's Looking Glass focused upon an aspect of the art world that is increasingly of interest to AKMA's executive director- art collectors and their collections. This exhibition featured the print collection of John Mallery. Over the summer, the AKMA hung the large abstract paintings of Nebraska painter Beverly Todd in the exhibition Looking Sideways. We also staged the first solo exhibition of photographer Neva Raylene that was titled In the early fall, the museum presented three exhibitions. Truth/Beauty/Spirit. Perspectives, The Biennial Missouri Western Faculty Exhibition, featured pieces by each member of the art faculty. My Story was a national call for entries that was subsequently juried. Each artist submitted a work of art that attempted to tell part of the story of their life and accompanied the piece with written text. We also staged a recent acquisition exhibition from the permanent collection. At the end of the year, two exhibitions focused on the twentieth century. Ross Braught: Man of Imagination presented the first career retrospective of the artist who died in 1983. Portraits Americana highlighted American modernist portraiture of the twentieth century. The Grimes Gallery, which is commonly known as the "Western Gallery," was completely rehung over the summer. Utilizing an entirely new perspective, the gallery investigates iterations of the word "Western" in visual art. Pop-Up exhibitions continued to appear throughout the museum in unexpected locations. Beverly Todd, Larry Thomas, Jonathan Knight, Don Beaulieu, the "Friends in Art" collective, Alexis Clement, and Sebastian Duesing each staged a Pop-Up exhibition in 2018. The museum sponsored two internships for Missouri Western State University students interested in art history in 2018. Madison McKinley interned at the museum over the summer and co-curated a small exhibition of Evan Lindquist in the Barclay Gallery with museum Registrar, Megan Benitz. In the fall, Alexis Carr interned. She and Megan co-curated an exhibition focused on John Falter in the Barclay Gallery. We welcomed two new team members this year. Bee Burgiss Hall joined the staff as Guest Services Coordinator this summer. Just a few weeks later, Christy George became our new Marketing and Communications Manager.

Marketing & Communications

I started my position as Marketing and Communications Manager in mid-August and in the last four and a half months since my arrival we successfully focused on increasing the number of Business Council Memberships. At the end of 2018 we had 270 Members, 27 Fellows, and 15 Business Council Memberships and look to increase those numbers by the end of 2019.

We also focused on expanding our social media presence in order to reach new audiences. The museum's Facebook, Instagram and Twitter following is on the rise. The combination of the museum's social media pages and email newsletter blasts have kept our members and followers updated on exhibitions, special events, classes and art related news and has helped grow interest and enthusiasm for the museum.

Education

2018 was a busy year in the Education Department, filled with new opportunities and lasting traditions. Children attended Kids Media Mix-up with Ms. A (Andrea Aeschliman) throughout the school year creating a new project each week. Girl Scouts earned art-themed merit badges in weekend art classes. Ms. Bee (Bee Burgiss Hall) taught Bee Creative exploring art inspired by nature. Everyone went home full after taking a cooking class with Chef Ralph and his kitchen staff. Awesomely Abstract Art Camp was our theme during two different sessions of our week-long summer camp taught by Ms. Molly (Molly Ring). Adult workshops included several sessions of our colored pencil workshops with Wanda Taylor. Donna Bland traveled from Texas to teach her biannual oil painting workshops. Amy Grier shared her knowledge of working with silk in her silk painting workshop. Artist Talks this year included Donna Bland presenting "Marketing Your Art" before her October workshop. Alexis Clements had a pop-up exhibition in the auditorium over the summer where she gave a presentation on her most recent body of work. Some of our most dedicated volunteers, the docents, gave over thirty-five tours in 2018 including all St. Joseph School District 5th graders, high schoolers from both Kansas and Missouri, private schools, homeschoolers, writing camp students, locals and traveling groups alike. Docents attended special exhibition presentations and enjoyed a group field trip to the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art in Kansas City.

2019 is already shaping up to be an exciting year for art workshops including returning artists Wanda Taylor and Donna Bland. Joining them will be a new workshop in watercolor taught by Lana Cease. Larry DeGraff will be joining us this summer to teach a class in oil painting. Other new workshops are still in the planning stages so check back with us regularly. Artist talks this year will include presentations by Patty Carroll, Donna Bland, and Larry DeGraff. Kids Media Mix-up classes are going stronger than ever and this year's Summer Camp is going to be based on our summer exhibition, Collecting in America: The Sabates African Art Collection. Sixteen tours are already planned for this spring and the docents will be going to the Spencer Museum of Art in Lawrence, Kansas for their field trip this year.

Office of the Registrar

2018 was a year of progress on several long-term projects in the collection management department. The growing permanent collection had left storage space in short supply. But, in February, Lawhon Construction was kind enough to donate their labor to expand the vault space by nearly a third. This expansion project served as a great opportunity for Dr. Knappe and me to assess items owned by the museum that have not been accessioned to the collection. Some of these items are being added to the permanent collection, while other items will be donated or sold help make the collection stronger and better managed. The items slated for sale are works given to the museum over the years with the understanding that they would likely not be accessioned into the permanent collection, many because they do not fit the scope of the museum's collecting focus of American Art. Lisa Sprague's gift of an iPad was a huge help in the ongoing process of digitizing images and records for the collection. The long term goal of having digital images of every work in the collection will be an asset for many activities in the museum, including registration, exhibitions, marketing, and education. In addition to the many fantastic exhibitions I was happy to be a part of, I was again lucky enough to work with Mosaic Lifecare on their Art Experience Gallery. In the spring 45 artists submitted 233 pieces for consideration, while the fall saw 32 artists submit 155.

Accessions

The permanent collection of the Albrecht-Kemper continues to grow each year. Our annual Society of Friends purchase this year was Mary Ann Strandell's Megan Draper's LA, a three-dimensional lenticular print that will be a stunning additional to the walls of our permanent collection galleries in the next few weeks. The other fifty-two pieces that were added to the permanent collection this year were all donated. Leading the charge this year were a number of artists who generously donated their work to the collection. New York photographer Larry Silver gifted twenty-two of his photographs to the museum. Nebraska painter Beverly Todd donated six of her abstract paintings to the collection. Local photographer Neva Raylene donated two photographs. St. Joseph native Richard Luboski is being recognized with a major auction of his work in Kansas City that ends in February, 2019. His brother, Don Luboski, has generously agreed to donate the profits of that sale to the museum and also gifted us six pieces by Richard Luboski. Three of these pieces can currently be seen in the theatre. Frequent donors, Edward and Marjorie Cahn donated four etchings by Gene Kloss. New York collector, Seth Medwick, donated a large painting by whimsical Kansas City artist Markus Pierson. John Silkiner donated four paintings by prairie painter Robert Sudlow. The museum also accessioned a late nineteenth century landscape by Gunther Hartwick that was donated by Candice Davis. Glenn Rand donated three photographs from his collection. Maryanne Charis donated two photographs by her late husband, Phillip Stewart Charis. Artist Andrea Morgenstern donated a watercolor and gauche piece. The museum's Arthur Kraft collection continues to grow with the donation of six paintings and a folio of five prints donated by the estate of Stuart and Suzi Hirschman. We are in the early stages of considering a future Arthur Kraft exhibition. Finally, Sean Cantrell gifted five watercolors by Jim Cantrell, whose work will be highlighted in a solo exhibition in 2021.


Finances


With a generous gift from the Fletcher Estate in the last days of the year, the museum's gross income (even excluding non-monetary art donations) topped \$687,000. That represents at least a two decade high-water mark. Furthermore, even before we received that munificent bequest, we had already met our expenses by raising over \$600,000. It was an exceptional financial year. Highlights included art classes that produced a net income increase of 59% from the previous year. Year-end giving rose 60%. Gift shop net income was up 49%. The third year of the quickly growing Witches Tea event saw a 221% increase in net profits. Even Sugar Plum, which is usually steady, saw a 25% increase in net profits.







